

PUBLIC NOTICE

Following the re-opening of the Kotoka International Airport, Accra to scheduled international commercial flights, the Mission has been receiving calls from Ghanaians in India on how they could fly out of India to Ghana. This is as a result of the continued closure of India Airports to scheduled international commercial passenger flights.

- 2. Consequently, the High Commission is considering seeking approval from the Indian and Ghanaian authorities on a possible third evacuation exercise for stranded Ghanaians in India and other nationals who **need** to travel to Ghana, possibly on 20th September, 2020.
- 3. To enable the High Commission to take an informed decision, all Ghanaian nationals in India and nationals of other countries with Ghana residence permits and or valid visa who are interested in going to Ghana are requested to register with the High Commission in the format below:
 - (a) Name
 - (b) Passport Number
 - (c) Contact details
 - (d) Date of arrival in India

- 5. The above information should be sent to the following email addresses of the High Commission by close of day, Tuesday 8th September, 2020: **chancery@ghana-mission.co.in** and **consular@ghana-mission.co.in**
- 6. The cost of flight tickets will be based on the number of persons who would have registered with the High Commission by 8th September, 2020.
- 7. All prospective passengers are to note that, per the new regulations at KIA, in addition to the existing COVID-19 protocols, they are required to present on arrival, a **Negative COVID-19 PCR test result** from an accredited laboratory **not more than 72 hours** before scheduled flight.
- 8. Passengers will also be subjected to a mandatory COVID-19 test at the airport terminal at the cost of **One Hundred and Fifty Dollars (\$150)** on arrival.
